Job Summary:

The Occupational therapist is a member of an interdisciplinary team which serves children from birth to 19 years of age. The therapist's role with young children, families and caregivers is one of facilitation and prevention using his/her specialized skills and knowledge to assist the child and family in their development in the home and other community settings. The OT also provides assessment, consultation, and program recommendations to parents and teachers in the school setting. It is the goal of therapists to work with school personnel and parents to enable the students to achieve their maximum potential and independence in all areas of life.

This position delivers services to the communities of the Upper Skeena region, the Hazeltons and Witset.
